- The incredible volcanic outcrops of Whangarei Heads and Bream Bay



HIGHLIGHTS

- The legacies of our gold-mining and kauri-milling past in the Coromandel

- A beach which has been voted into the world's top ten (New Chums)

- 2 very unusual features surpassing most of their counterparts overseas (Rotorua)
- The most beautiful thermal lake in NZ, a hidden gem seen by few (Echo Lake)
- The superbly scenic setting of NZ's fastest-growing coastal city (Tauranga)
- Several species of tree that are the tallest or largest in the world (Tauranga)

WILD AND WINSOME WAIRARAPA (with southern Hawke's Bay)

1-7 February 2026

HIGHLIGHTS

- The largest mainland gannet colony in the world (Cape Kidnappers)
- NZ's second largest pa (Otatara)
- A tiny town with no less than 11 registered historic buildings (Ongaonga)
- The longest place name in New Zealand and the world (Porangahau)
- An historic lighthouse sitting high above a spectacular coastline (Castlepoint)
- The most extensive "Badlands" or hoodoos formations in NZ (Putangirua)
- A rail crossing that was unique in the world (Remutaka)

CAPITAL KAPITI (Wellington, Horowheua, Manawatu) 8-14 February 2026

HIGHLIGHTS

- The wild seascapes, seals and geology of Cook Strait
- "Lord of the Rings" locations along the river in the Hutt Valley
- The glorious cityscapes and harbour views of Wellington
- Mountains hugging beaches along the Kapiti coastal strip
- The weird "Bridge to Nowhere", built but never used
- The most polluted river in NZ, but one that carved an impressive gorge (Manawatu)

TANTALIZING TARANAKI: 15-21 February 2026

HIGHLIGHTS

- The astounding volcanic vistas of New Zealand's very own "Mount Fuji" (Taranaki)
- The highest waterfall in the North Island (Damper Falls)
- The wild west coast at Tongaporutu: rolling surf, black sand, white cliffs
- Taranaki voted by "Lonely Planet" (in 2017) as the 2nd best region in the world to visit
- New Plymouth's spectacular coastal walkway and Rewarewa Bridge

EXCEPTIONAL EASTLAND (with northern Hawke's Bay)

28 February – 6 March 2027

HIGHLIGHTS

- The world's largest Pohutukawa tree (Te Araroa)
- The easternmost point in the North Island (East Cape)
- The first city in the world to see the morning sun, the place where Captain Cook first landed, and the largest carved meeting-house in NZ (Gisborne)
- Natural hot springs in a stunning nikau forest (Morere)
- Limestone Caves, pristine lakes, quiet beaches, dramatic bluffs (Te Urewera)
- NZ's highest bridge, with windbreaks to protect the trains (Mohaka)
- A totally weird geological formation fit for a belfry (Bell Rock)
- The largest mainland gannet colony in the world (Cape Kidnappers)
- NZ's second largest pa (Otatara)

TOP-NOTCH TAUPO and TUMULTUOUS TONGARIRO: 7-13 March 2027

HIGHLIGHTS

- NZ's largest lake, created by the biggest volcanic eruption on the planet (Taupo)
- Millions of litres plunging through a narrow gorge like a washing machine (Huka Falls)
- The 3 magnificent volcanoes in our first national park, a World Heritage Area (Tongariro)
- NZ's worst railway disaster and carrot capital (Tangiwai/Ohakune)
- New Zealand's most famous and popular one-day walk (Tongariro Crossing)
- One of New Zealand's most spectacular examples of railway engineering (Raurimu)
- New Zealand's largest totara tree (Pouakani)
- The area where they catch a trout and shoot a deer in the same morning (Rangipo)
- Forest giants and melodious birdsong in a forest saved from the axe (Pureora)
- Walkways, waterfalls and rapids along our longest waterway (Waikato River)
